Building

- Hull was made by overlapping planks
- secured with iron rivets
- wool string dipped in tar was wedged in between the planks
- oak was the most common wood used
- rigging was made from horsehair or walrus hide


The Drekar

- dragon-headed longships
 - stealthy troop-carriers
 - cross the open oceans under sail and then switch to oars for lightning-fast hitand-run attacks



Two different classes of Viking era ships

warships called langskip merchant ships called knörr

- Dragon head on the bow to protect from evil
- Shallow draft allowed them to go ashore on any beach
 - not reliant on harbour
- First Europeans to reach America
 - around the year 1000 (Leif Eriksson)

these skin ropes were highly prized, and were an important trade item. They were probably made by cutting the hide in a spiral around the body of the creature
